When Canyon del Oro High School's Ka'Deem Carey scampered into the end zone for his third and final touchdown on Friday night, an Ironwood Ridge defender stripped the ball from his hands and shared some heated words with the running back.

The 20-yard run gave the host Dorados a 20-point lead en route to a 27-13 season-opening victory over their Oro Valley rival, only intensifying hurt feelings.

Carey used his explosiveness and ability to find holes to express himself and run for 190 yards on 25 carries. He also scored on an 80-yard kickoff return — after dropping the ball — for a 14-7 CDO lead in the second quarter and a 6-yard run early in the third quarter for a 20-7 CDO lead.

"Not only is he quick, he doesn't lay down on first contact," Dorados coach Dustin Peace said.

Carey, a 5-foot-9-inch, 184-pound junior, turned a miscue into perhaps the game's most electrifying moment — the ball deflected off his chest on the kickoff return at the 10-yard line, he picked it up at the 20-yard line and found his way to the end zone.

"I was just so excited to get the kickoff. ... I just wanted to hit the hole and I was concentrating on the hole and not the ball," Carey said.

"They set great blocks and I fed off them," Carey said.

In his first career start, Lewis went 7 for 11 for 69 yards with a 6-yard touchdown pass after the Dorados blocked a 27-yard field goal attempt.

"We're replacing a great senior class," said Ironwood Ridge coach Matt Johnson, who, like Peace, is in his first season leading his team. "My kids really competed with a great program. We're close to being pretty good. It's just going to take us some time. Tonight was one of those lessons."

Last season, CDO went 11-2 and advanced to the 4A-I state semifinals. Ironwood Ridge finished 10-3 and lost in the 5A-II state semis. Shortly before halftime, the Nighthawks missed an opportunity, as Tyler D'Amore's 34-yard heave into the end zone was ruled incomplete.
